6. Review of NAO Corporate Governance

Attached to the report was a copy of the Tiner report together with the response by the Public Accounts Commission.

It was agreed that it would be appropriate for an analysis to be carried out of Audit Scotland's procedures as against the proposals in the Tiner report and Government response. It was accordingly agreed that a further report should be submitted analysing the issues, showing where Audit Scotland was already compliant and where it would be appropriate for changes to be made.

7. <u>Ethical Governance</u>

There was submitted a report by the Director of Audit Strategy updating the Board on the implementation of ethical standards for Auditors in Audit Scotland and on a number of the issues that arose in respect of the running of the business. It was noted that the Management Team had concluded that the ethical standards principles should apply to all staff and discussion took place on the position of confidentiality in respect of secondees and possible difficulties in respect of services being shared with other bodies.

The position was noted.

8. Corporate Homicide Act 2007

There was submitted a report by the Director of Corporate Services providing an initial briefing on the implications for Audit Scotland of the Corporate Homicide Act 2007 which would come into force on 6 April 2008.

It was agreed that strategic health and safety issues, including any relating to corporate homicide, should be included within the remit of the Audit Committee; that it should be part of the annual internal audit programme, to inform the annual report of assurance; and that a briefing session be held for members at the next Audit Scotland meeting.

9. Performance Update – Quarter 3 Report 2007/08

6. <u>Scottish Commission for Public Audit's Report on Audit Scotland's Corporate</u> <u>Governance</u>

There was submitted a report by the Auditor General giving an overview of the issues raised by the SCPA's recent review of Audit Scotland's governance arrangements. The Board was invited to consider its response to the issues raised by the report and agree a way forward.

It was reported that the Parliament had established an ad hoc committee, entitled the Review of SPCB Supported Bodies Committee to consider and report on matters relating to bodies supported by the SPCB, including the issues raised by the SCPA. It

was anticipated that the Accounts Commission, the Auditor General and Audit Scotland would all be invited to submit written evidence.

Consideration was given to Annex A to the report which summarised the main recommendations of the SCPA report and commented on them. The following points were made with regard to specific recommendations:-

- "AGS may not apply for any post during term of office—T&C should compensate for earnings gap"—it would be important to ensure that the restrictions were not so onerous that it would be impossible to recruit to the post
- 'Consideration by SPCB whether the post of DAG should be a formal statutory post'-this would require some further consideration
- 'Retain functions and processes of the AC but recommendation for a review with the aim of simplifying the structure'—Audit Scotland should look for positive solutions in this regard and should give consideration to the paper being presented to the Accounts Commission on options, including putting in place arrangements for reporting to the Scottish Parliament
- "The SCPA's role as focus for political accountability, and not to have the functions
 of the Board'—it was noted that the SCPA Clerk would liaise with Diane McGiffen
 regarding the production of a new protocol
- 'Board of five, consisting of AGS, Chair of the AC and three independent non members'—the current size of the Board is considered to be appropriate
- 'Board members to be appointed for a fixed term'—consideration would need to be given to the appointment of Isabelle Low and Caroline Gardner in this respect.

Discussion thereafter took place on the anticipated invitation to submit written evidence to the Committee. The view was that it would be appropriate to make one joint submission from all three parties, if this proved possible, but that individual responses could be made in respect of any items where different views were held. Consideration would need to be given in this regard to the paper being prepared for the Accounts Commission on options with relation to its functions and processes.

(Action – further consideration of proposed submission to Committee – Chair/Auditor General)

7. Strategic Statement between the Accounts Commission and the Auditor General for Scotland on the principles of public audit and the publication of Audit Scotland's Corporate Plan

There was submitted report by the Auditor General for Scotland together with a joint report from the Chair of the Accounts Commission and the Auditor General which had been considered by the Accounts Commission earlier in the day on the proposal that a joint statement be published on the principles of public audit in Scotland. The report also set out the timescale for production of the Audit Scotland Corporate Plan.

The Chair reported that the Accounts Commission had approved the preparation of a joint strategic statement and the revision of the protocol between the Auditor General and the Accounts Commission on how they would exercise their functions in relation to Audit Scotland.

It was noted that Board approval for the Corporate Plan was needed in early December and agreed that a meeting be held on 9 December at 10am for this purpose.

2. Minutes

3. Audit Committee

The minutes of meeting of the Audit Committee of 19 November 2008 were submitted and noted.

4. <u>Joint Statement by the Auditor General for Scotland and the Accounts Commission for Scotland on the Principles of Public Audit</u>

There was submitted a report by the Auditor General with attached a draft Joint Statement by the Auditor General and the Accounts Commission on the Principles of Public Audit in Scotland. In part, the statement was designed to provide a strategic context for the Audit Scotland Corporate Plan and would be presented to the Accounts Commission at its December meeting.

Following discussion, during which a number of detailed points were made relating to wording, it was agreed:-

- i. that the need for elected representatives and the public to understand and have confidence in the arrangements for independent scrutiny of public bodies should be included as a fundamental principle;
- ii. that the last sentence in the document should refer to the requirement on Audit Scotland regularly to monitor performance against the Corporate Plan;
- iii. that a revised draft document be emailed to all members of the Board for consideration prior to its submission to the Accounts Commission, and
- iv. once the document had been approved by the Accounts Commission and Auditor General it be sent to appropriate stakeholders as an "exposure draft" for their consideration.

5. Audit Scotland Corporate Plan 2009/12

There was submitted a report by the Auditor General for Scotland presenting a draft Corporate Plan for Audit Scotland for 2009/12. The plan had been prepared following extensive consultation with clients and stakeholders and would be supported internally by detailed sector plans.

Following considerable discussion it was agreed:-

that the plan should place more emphasis on public engagement and assurance by highlighting the considerable work which was done to that end, and

ii. to approve the Corporate Plan in principle subject to some minor amendments to wording.

6. <u>2009/10 Budget</u>

There was submitted a report by the Director of Corporate Services referring to the meeting of the Board on 16 September 2008 when the 2009/10 budget had been approved and the Board had requested a further report which included the cost implications of the decisions of the Remuneration Committee in respect of the Reward Strategy. Attached to the report was a copy of the final budget submission to the SCPA.

Discussion took place on how Audit Scotland should respond. With regard to the recommendations of the Crerar Review it was agreed that a written submission be made reporting progress and enclosing the exchange of letters between the Cabinet Secretary and Chair of the Accounts Commission.
